Submission of Samples for Companion Animal and Equine Quarantine Testing – International Submissions

The CSIRO Australian Centre for Disease Preparedness – Australian Animal Health Laboratory (ACDP-AAHL) offers quarantine testing to facilitate the international transport of companion animals. ACDP - AAHL's diagnostic testing is accredited for:

- import and export of animals to and from Australia, and
- transport of animals between other nations

Prior to submitting samples for quarantine testing, it is important that you check with the importing country as to which tests are required. For movements into and out of Australia, please check the <u>Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment website</u> for details.

This document provides detailed sample submission instructions for those wishing to <u>submit</u> samples from outside Australia.

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1. Tests and Price List

For details regarding available tests, testing schedules and prices, please visit the ACDP website.

Quarantine tests are performed on a weekly schedule as shown <u>here</u>. Results will be available by close of business (COB) on the day listed for each test. Alterations to the schedule may occur as a result of public holidays or urgent disease exclusion testing. Planned upcoming schedule alterations can be found <u>here</u>.

If your test result is required urgently, please contact ACDP Accessions prior to sample submission.

Please note an additional 'Customs and Handling' fee applies to overseas submissions. Details regarding this fee can be found <u>here</u>. This fee is applied once per submission and is required to cover the cost of quarantine clearance. Payment must be made prior to the results being issued.

Please note that from time to time a test may need to be repeated to obtain a valid result. Where possible, travel dates should be arranged so as not to create deadlines too close to the expected reporting dates listed on the ACDP-AAHL website.

2. Sample Collection and Labelling

Serum is the required sample for all standard companion and equine tests. Blood should be collected into serum separator tubes (SST) or plain tubes. Tubes should be centrifuged and the serum separated off into a separate plastic, sealable tube prior to submission. Prior to submission, inspect the serum to ensure it is clear, as haemolysed samples may not be suitable for testing. Please ensure that at least 1 mL of clear serum is submitted to ensure that sufficient volume is available for diagnostic testing.

It is important for the purposes of quarantine compliance that all sample tubes are directly and clearly labelled with the animal's name AND unique microchip number. Failure to do so may result in diagnostic reports being unacceptable to quarantine authorities.

3. Submission Paperwork

All samples submitted to ACDP - AAHL for diagnostic testing must be accompanied by a completed <u>ACDP - AAHL</u> submission form.

When submitting samples from multiple pets belonging to a single owner:

- If individual reports are required, please use a separate submission form for each animal.
- Alternatively, all animals may be included on one submission form. In this case, a single report will be issued detailing all test results.

Please ensure that the microchip number listed on the paperwork is correct and matches the number on the sample tube exactly.

Please contact the relevant government agency of the importing country to determine the specific tests required. Please be as specific as possible when listing the required tests on the submission paperwork.

4. Sample Packaging

When submitting samples from outside Australia, a number of requirements apply. Please read the following information carefully.

A prepaid courier should be used for international delivery of specimens. Please consult with your selected courier regarding the specific requirements for packaging and shipment of diagnostic specimens. The cost of shipping samples to ACDP - AAHL must be covered by the submitter. Prior to dispatch, please notify <u>ACDP</u>
<u>Accessions</u> of your submission via email, and include a copy of the consignment note provided by the courier.

All overseas submissions must be accompanied by:

- ACDP AAHL's relevant Australian Government Department of Agriculture import permit
- A completed Payment Form
- A completed ACDP AAHL Sample Submission form
- A written health certificate completed by the registered Veterinary Surgeon who collected the blood sample
 certifying that the health status of the animal complies with the requirements of the import permit for the
 specimens.

Please consult with the courier company regarding sample packaging requirements. IATA and Australia Post regulations allow samples collected from healthy animals, where there is no clinical suspicion of disease, to be shipped as 'Exempt Animal Specimens'. The submitter is responsible for ensuring that the samples meet the criteria for exemption. For further information, please refer to the <u>IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations 3.6.2</u> <u>Division 6.2</u> or consult your chosen courier.

Please note that samples from animals with clinical disease must not be shipped as 'Exempt Animal Specimens' and are subject to more stringent regulations. Please contact ACDP Accessions if you wish to submit a case for clinical disease testing.

Samples should be packaged in accordance with IATA regulations, in consultation with the courier. As a guide, 'Exempt Animal Specimens' should be packaged as follows:

- 1. Serum should be placed into a primary receptacle. The primary receptacle must be leak-proof.
- 2. The primary receptacle **must** be placed <u>inside</u> leak-proof secondary packaging, along with sufficient absorbent cushioning material to absorb the entire volume of serum were it to leak during transport.
 - NB: Multiple serum samples may be placed within one secondary receptacle provided there is sufficient absorbent material to absorb the entire contents of all primary receptacles in the event of a leak.
- 3. The secondary packaging **must** be placed into outer packaging of adequate strength to prevent damage during transport, and with at least one surface having minimum dimensions of 100 mm × 100 mm. Sufficient cushioning material should be placed between the secondary and outer packaging to prevent the sample from damage during transport. Please ensure a completed AAHL submission form is placed inside the outer packaging.

The external surface of the outer package and/or outer wrapping should be marked with:

- Name and address of the sender and receiver
- o Name and telephone number of the person responsible for the shipment
- The words 'Exempt Animal Specimen'

Please see the table below for examples of suitable containers and packaging materials.

Examples of suitable materials for the packaging of 'Exempt Animal Specimens'

Receptable Type	Examples of appropriate containers and/or packaging materials
Primary receptacle (containing serum)	Screw cap sterile sample tubeScrew cap centrifuge tubesPlain Blood tube
Absorbent material	Cotton woolCombine dressing
Secondary packaging	 Biohazard bag Snap-lock plastic bag Plastic bottle with screw lid
Cushioning material	Cotton woolShredded newspaperBubble wrap
Outer packaging	 Despatch satchel Plastic box Cardboard box Supported polystyrene box

The required paperwork should be packed as follows:

Enclose the following forms inside the outer package:

- 1. The Import Permit for the samples, which can be obtained by contacting ACDP Accessions
- 2. A completed ACDP AAHL Sample Submission form
- 3. A completed Payment Form

Enclose these forms in the document envelope on the outside of the package:

- 1. The Import Permit for the samples
- 2. The Health Certificate
- 3. A copy of the completed ACDP AAHL Sample Submission form
